Increasingly, clients are demanding via contract that design firms meet a fiduciary obligation. Such a demand is beyond the firm's obligation to provide professional services, and may create a situation where a firm could assume a higher level of responsibility without understanding the ramifications of serving as a fiduciary. Although licensing laws and codes of ethics do not establish a fiduciary duty, managing the financial affairs of the client may result in significant risks as a fiduciary duty.
